Title

Classics of the History of Analytic Philosophy

Course Description

The course aims at giving the main ideas of the founders of Analytic Philosophy, mainly Gottlob Frege's conception of mathematical logic, Bertrand Russell's view on perception, and Ludwig Wittgenstein's framework in *Tractatus*. The topics treated are given in the detailed specification of the course, with a list of reading for each Author.

Course organization

The course will be organized as a full week (morning and afternoon) with lectures, questions and answers, and students are required active participation to the discussion.
