Title

International Workshop: Perspective in Platonism: Towards a New Agenda, Organized by Arianna Piazzalunga and Federico M. Petrucci

Course Description

In the last three years important books and papers have been published, radically changing many traditional views on the Platonist Tradition as well as showing the originality of the philosophical systems of these authors. This new attitude rescued the studies on Platonism from a somewhat fossilized approach and opened up several research paths that still are to be explored. On the other hand, the monumental series *Der Platonismus in der Antike* is going to be completed, and this allows its overall consideration. In this framework, the Workshop aims to provide inputs for a new agenda for research on the Platonist Tradition, for the points of view of both methods and contents.

The Workshop will consist in a series of 8 papers, each followed by extensive discussion.
