### II Geneva Graduate Conference in Political Philosophy

1-2 February 2021

#### CALL FOR PAPERS

The **Department of Political Science & International Relations** of the **University of Geneva** is proud to announce the second edition of the Geneva Graduate Conference in Political Philosophy organized within the framework of the **Geneva Colloquium in Political Theory (GECOPOL)**. The *GECOPOL\_Graduate* will take place on 1-2 February 2021 in an **online format**. The conference is a forum for PhD students to present their works in progress, receive constructive feedback in a supportive atmosphere, and exchange ideas both with peers and with leading academics in the field of political philosophy worldwide. The *GECOPOL\_Graduate* is structured in parallel sessions for students' presentations, and two plenary sessions hosting two keynote lectures. The keynote speakers in the past edition were Fabienne Peter (Warwick) and Francis Cheneval (Zürich). This year's **keynote speakers** are:

PhD students may express their interest in giving papers at the *GECOPOL\_Graduate* by sending an **extended abstract** of their intended contribution (max 1500 words – in **English**) accompanied by a **short abstract** (max 200 words – in **English**) and a *curriculum vitae*, by **15 November 2020**. Paper proposals may focus on any area within political philosophy and should be suitable for a twenty-minute presentation. Both the short and the extended abstract must be anonymized for **blind review**. The submission of paper proposals is open to graduate students enrolled in a PhD programme at the time of submission. **Conference attendance is free** of charge and open to anyone upon registration. Anyone who wishes to attend the conference without presenting a paper should register by 15 November. Details about the conference programme and other arrangements regarding online access to the various activities to follow. The working language of the *GECOPOL\_Graduate* is English.
