

# **FINO PhD Program in Philosophy**

## **Theoretical curriculum**

*The course is open to all Curricula, all years of the FINO PhD program, but is mandatory for cycles 36 and 37 of the Theoretical Curriculum*

### **Title**

*The transcendental foundation within the phenomenological tradition*

### **Course Description**

The course aims at providing an outline of the phenomenological tradition, by focusing on the question of the transcendental foundation, which is assumed to be the core of the phenomenological stance. The foundational character of the latter will show its theoretical efficacy by considering how the phenomenological discourse (notwithstanding the differences that exist among the authors who can be ascribed to the phenomenological movement) is able to justify the necessary – even if paradoxical – intertwinement between ontology and epistemology.

### **Course organization**

4 Lectures (for a total of 12 hours). Each lecture will be structured so as to allow a permanent interaction between the teacher and the students. This interaction aims at both improving students' dialogical competence, and fostering their capability in elaborating critically the contents offered during the course. Teaching language: Italian.
